

Spring Fling – Pro Event

April 17, 2011 at Kit Carson Park
Escondido Rotary Club Disc Golf Course
(A Steady Ed Tour Event)

Thank you for your interest in supporting/participating in the Spring Fling – Pro Event at Kit Carson Park. Over the past few months, the San Diego Aces Disc Golf Association has made excellent progress to improve the course while meeting the requests of the community. The course is approaching its one-year anniversary and thousands of people have ventured out to enjoy this free course since it opened.

The following information is for park users, participants, and spectators:

The disc golf course will be closed to the general public on Sunday, April 17, 2011. Spectators and park users looking to find out more information prior to the event should contact Mark Verrochi (603-986-7314 or mtv@alum.wpi.edu) or visit Tournament Central adjacent to the amphitheatre on the day of the event.

Activities open to the general public, spectators, and participants include a Hole-in-One Contest, Vendor Booths, and a Raffle. All proceeds of these activities will go toward tournament expenses and payout.

Fundraiser Discs:

SP Hurricanes available for \$20 each.

Hole-in-One contest:

Can you throw a disc 150 feet? If so, come out and try our hole in one contest. We will be giving away three brand new portable Mach III baskets provided by Disc Golf Association (DGA). Each attempt will cost \$1 or you may purchase six attempts for \$5. Participants will be required to use the provided DGA mid-ranges or putters (discs to be determined). Participants will stand at a tee box and throw towards three baskets lined up near each other. If you get the disc to land in any of the three baskets, you qualify to win one of the baskets. At the end of the day, three people will each take home a basket. If there are more than three people that get a hole-in-one, anyone that got more than one hole in one automatically wins a basket and a CTP will be completed to determine the remaining winners. The hole in one contest will run from 8:00 AM until the start of the awards ceremony (between 4:30 PM and 5:00 PM).

Vendor Booths:

Vendor booths will be setup throughout the day near the amphitheatre. Vendors will have disc golf related items available for sale. Please support our vendors; they are a big part of making this event a success. If you are a vendor and would like to setup a table at the event, please contact Mark Verrochi ASAP.

Raffle:

You must be present to win. Raffle tickets will be available on the day of the event (\$1 each, \$5 for six tickets, \$10 for 14 tickets, or \$20 for 35 tickets). Raffle prizes include discs, hats, etc. donated by many individuals/companies along with a coated portable Mach III basket provided by DGA. If you would like to donate "schwag" to the raffle, please contact Mark Verrochi. The raffle will take place at the end of the day after the tournament has ended and scores have been finalized (between 4:30 PM and 5:30 PM).

Other information:

Available at tournament central all day: 32 oz Gatorade for \$2 each and 17 oz bottled waters for \$1 each.

Available near Hole 13: Lemonade (to be determined – last year the neighbors had a lemonade stand).

The following details are provided for tournament participants:

The address for Kit Carson Park is 333 Bear Valley Parkway South Escondido, California 92025 (only a few minutes east of Interstate 15 (Via Rancho Parkway exit). Enter the park at the fire station and veer to the right. Tournament Central will be located adjacent to the amphitheatre and the two practice baskets.

Schedule:

The schedule will be posted at Tournament Central. Schedule is subject to change depending on length of the disc golf rounds. The following is an approximate schedule for the event.

Lunch:

Tina's Deli has come through again as a sponsor for our event. Lunches should be purchased in advance (at the time of tournament registration) but some may be available on tournament day. Lunches cost \$6 each and include a sandwich (turkey, ham, or veggie), chips, cookies, and bottled water.

Course Rules:

There is no smoking or drinking permitted in Kit Carson Park. The only designated smoking areas are the city sidewalk adjacent to Hole 3 and the city street near the tee box for Hole 12 (both of these locations are outside the park boundaries).

Restrooms are located adjacent to the amphitheatre, Hole 7, and Hole 9. Public urination is not allowed in Kit Carson Park. Water is available at all restrooms and at drinking fountains throughout the park.

Course Layout:

The course layout for the tournament will be the same for both rounds and will be as follows.

1. Standard position.
2. Right position.
3. Long position.
4. Long position.
5. Temporary tee box – back about 50 feet (just before two-way caution sign).
6. Temporary tee box – across bridge and back near two large rocks.
7. Temporary tee box – directly between the snake tail and the bathrooms.
8. Temporary basket –moved to grass area near bathrooms. Spotter present to watch for cars.
9. Temporary tee box – back about 100-150 feet from its current location.
10. Standard position.
11. Long right position.
12. Standard position.
13. Basket in new left position.
14. (Formerly 15) Long position.
15. (Formerly 16) Temporary tee box – back about 50 feet.
16. (New 16) Location still to be determined out near the orange trees beyond the fence for 15.
17. Standard position.
18. Temporary tee box – up hill about 100 feet back from current location.

Course Out of Bounds (OB), Mandatory Locations, Etc.:

The two meter rule is in effect.

OB lines are clearly defined on the course. In the event that OB is unclear and the group is unsure of the ruling, ask a spotter or contact the Tournament Director (Mark Verrochi).

***All concrete/pavement paths and roads are considered OB unless noted.

** Single OB line runs down creek on holes 6-11 and 14. If your comes to rest on the side of the line opposite of the basket you are shooting at, you are OB.

1. OB woods on right and left.
2. OB woods on right and beyond basket. Double mandatory. If your first shot goes OB before reaching mandatory or you miss the mandatory, take next shot from drop zone with penalty.
3. OB woods beyond basket. Sidewalk and beyond is OB.
4. OB woods right, left, and beyond basket.
5. Mandatory tree. Missed mandatory results in throwing from forward tee box with penalty.
6. ** Drop zone is the "standard" forward tee. Take penalty and play from drop zone if disc does not touch in bounds off tee box.
7. ** Mandatory tree. Concrete path and beyond (past the basket) is OB.
8. ** Road and bridge are OB. Concrete path and beyond (on right) is OB.
9. ** No additional OB comments.
10. ** Mandatory tree. Beyond fence is OB.
11. ** Beyond fence is OB. Stream bed near basket is OB. "Island" around basket clearly defined.
12. Beyond fence is OB.
13. Beyond fence on either side of fairway is OB (except woodchip landing area).
14. ** (Formerly 15) Double mandatory. If you miss mandatory, next shot from drop zone with penalty.
15. (Formerly 16) Beyond fence is OB.
16. (New 16) Beyond fence is OB.
17. Mandatory tree. Beyond fence is OB.
18. Dirt road on right of fairway and beyond is OB.

Payout:

I expect the payout to be over 100% of tournament entry fees. Actual payout will be based on number of players participating, raffle funds, and hole in one contest funds.

Hand made basket trophies will also be provided for winners of all divisions. Additional trophies will be awarded in divisions with more than four entrants.

Scheduled Work Days – Saturday April 2nd and Saturday April 9th after doubles (approximately 12:00 PM). Please come out and help us fix the tee box for hole 8 and install the "18th hole" between old holes 16 and 17. We will also be working on fixing up other tee boxes and finalizing tee and hole positions for the tournament.
